Vedem Underground is a multimedia project that celebrates the valiant effort and heart-wrenching legacy made by teenage boys in a Terezin concentration camp during WWII. These boys risked their lives and the lives of their loved ones to create a secret magazine that details their thoughts and opinions of their lives in the ghetto. Using a combination of graphic and cartoon art, photographs taken from within the camp, and the writing of the magazine authors, Vedem: The Underground Magazine of the Terezin Ghetto breaks down the 83 weekly issues totaling 800 pages, reconstructing them in the form of a contemporary magazine.
